Purpose

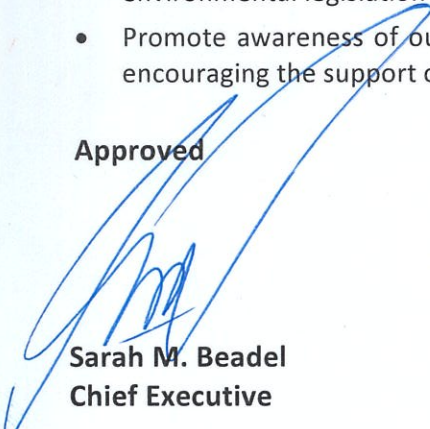
To describe Wildland Consultants Ltd commitment to protection of the environment.

Policy
